

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' MEETING HELD IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, THE 26th DAY OF MAY, 1969.

Meeting opened at 10:00 O'Clock A. M. with Commissioner Hazleton in the Chair.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED.

Motion for approval was made by Commissioner Black with the addition "That the County Attorney was consulted before the Commission took action to deny the renewal of the Beer License of John B. Lester". Approval was seconded by Commissioner Young and carried unanimously.

SPRAY BILL-PAYMENT REFUSED BY FROST BLACK

The Clerk reported on a delinquent bill for spraying weeds, and the land owner had stated that he did not plan to pay for the chemical or the service of the County rig.

The Commissioners stated that they would write a letter requesting payment of the account as it was a just bill.

CUSTODIAN REPLACEMENT DISCUSSED

An Annexation to the City of Monticello having been received from the City Council, the County Commission unanimously approved the document and signed it. The area annexed is owned by Gordon Hyde, et ux and Nina C. Hyde and a Car Washing facility is being presently constructed on it.

COMMISSIONER YOUNG REPORTS ON PUBLIC LANDS MEET AND GOVERNOR'S VISIT TO CANYONLANDS AREA

In reporting on the Public Lands Meet held in Twin Falls, Commissioner Young stated that he thought it wise to request the Meetings be held in San Juan County in 1970 or 1971, as San Juan County has a higher percent of Public Lands within their boundary than any other County now in the Association.

In reporting on the Governors' trip to Canyonlands, Commissioner Young stated that the weather was ideal and the entire trip was very satisfactory. He stated that the County got good publicity; that the Park Service is apparently behind in development and is without a Master Plan to guide their progress.

Bob Fellmeth met with the Commission to discuss exemptions for Veterans and widows and abatements on taxes. He was advised that these matters would be considered on Equalization Days - set for June 3rd & June 17th.
