MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 26, 1979.

PRESENT: Chairman E. S. Boyle, Commissioner Bill Dunow. Commissioner Calvin Black being excused from the meeting to be in Washington D. C. Also present, Al Haskins and Deputy Clerk, Peggy Jorgensen.

TIME: 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of the previous weeks minutes were read and approved, this being done on a motion made by Commissioner Dunow and seconded by Commissioner Boyle who relinquished the Chair to carry the motion.

COMMISSIONER DUNOW REPORTS:

Commissioner Bill Dunow reported that Commission Chairman Lewis Bucklow of Delores County had contacted him and that Delores County will honor the snow removal agreement with San Juan County for clearing snow at Ucolo.

Commissioner Dunow also reported that the Christmas Party will be December 21, 1979 at 1:00 P.M. according to County Recorder Louise Jones who is in charge of the party this year.

Commissioner Dunow further reported that people building in the County are not getting their building permits. He has checked with the Sheriff regarding this matter and the Building Inspectors for the County are charged with enforcing the law on this matter. Failure to obtain a building permit constitutes a misdemeanor and punishable as provided by law.

COMMISSIONER BOYLE:

Commissioner Boyle reported that he had received a letter regarding population estimates from

John Brockbert of the Utah Population Work Committee of the Department of Vital Statistics for the State of Utah. Mr. Haskins was asked to fill out the enclosed questionnaire and return it with the correct population figures that had been accepted by the Legislative Analyst of the State of Utah.

AL HASKINS:

Al Haskins reported that John Scott has been chosen to be the Executive Director of the SEU-CAP Board,

Al Also presented the following Employment Policy for County Mini-Bus Drivers. Commissioner Dunow made the Motion that the Commission accept the policy with Commissioner Boyle relinquishing the Chair to second and carry the motion.

EMPLOYMENT POLICY FOR SAN JUAN COUNTY PASSENGER BUS DRIVERS:

1. To be employed as a San Juan County passenger bus driver an applicant must have at time of employment:
 - A. A valid Utah chauffeurs license of the class required to drive a passenger bus for hire. This license must be kept current during time of employment.
 - B. A Medical Examiner's Certificate showing that the applicant is physically qualified in accordance with Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, (49 CFR 391.41) to drive passenger buses for hire. In cases of employees under 65 years of age this certificate must be renewed annually. In cases of employees 65 years of age or older, this certificate must be renewed semi-annually.
2. As soon as possible after employment an employee must complete satisfactorily an official defensive driving course and must continue to take and pass such course annually. Drivers may also be required to take other bus driving courses.
3. San Juan County will pay for required driving courses and physical examinations but will not pay drivers for time required to take such courses and examinations.
4. Drivers employed by San Juan County at the time of adoption of these policies must conform at the earliest practical opportunity.
5. Drivers will be responsible for the maintenance and cleanliness of buses. Drivers will be responsible for a daily inspection of the bus to be driven and will record on a pretrip inspection checkoff sheet, any repairs or maintenance needed and when such conditions are corrected. Special consideration will be given to safety factors.

JIM BLACK- AIRPORT:

Jim Black met with the Commission to discuss with them the condition of the airport and the need for the strips to be plowed more often than they are now. He stated to the Commission that the runways are dangerous and that the chances of pilots not knowing the strip having a terrible accident are great. The Commissioners discussed this and the hangers with Mr. Black at length. Commissioner Boyle stated that he would get in touch with Ron Thebold of the Utah Department of Transportation in charge of airports for aid in repairing an upkeeping the airport.

CURT PEHRSON- SOUTHERN PLANNER AOG:

Curt Pehrson, southern planner for the Association of Governments met with the Commission to discuss with them the preparation of a Master Plan for the County.

CORRESPONDANCE:

Commissioner Boyle presented a letter he had received from Dixie Barker requesting a letter from the County to the State Travel Council regarding matching funds. Commissioner Boyle will write a letter on this matter strongly stating the County's stand if there is equal representation.


JIM DANDY:

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING HELD DECEMBER 3, 1979.

PRESENT: CHAIRMAN E. S. BOYLE, COMMISSIONERS BILL DUNOW AND CALVIN BLACK. ALSO PRESENT AL HASINS AND DEPUTY CLERK PEGGY JORGENSEN.

TIME: 10:20 A.M.

Upon a motion made by Commissioner Dunow and seconded by Commissioner Black the minutes of the previous weeks meeting were approved.

COMMISSIONER BOYLE:

Commissioner Boyle reported that he will be attending a Health Board meeting Wednesday evening. He stated that the applicants for a replacement for Marion Hazleton have been screened down to four. Commissioner Boyle added that he will make a recommendation that all but \$50,000 of the surplus funds be used through distribution of the Michigan Formula to the four counties involved for their health budgets.

Commissioner Boyle stated that he had attended the Chamber of Commerce meeting last week and that Gary Wicks had spoken to the group. Mr. Wicks is a representative for the B.L.M.

EMT's

The Commission expressed its appreciation and recognition of the Monticello EMT's for their prompt action wherein they saved a mans life after a house he was helping to set up fell pinning him underneath. The quick action and the skill and diligence of the EMT's and those on the scene deserve commendation.

COMMISSIONER DUNOW:

Commissioner Dunow reported that vandalism on equipment off Highway 95 has been taking place and that two Cat's have been sanded. The Commission will support the Sheriff's office in any way necessary to stop the vandalism that has been taking place in the County.

Commissioner Dunow also reported that there are some bulbs burned out at the airport. He further reported that the septic tank there had been cleaned out and that Mike Crittenden is digging two new drainfields to solve the sewage problems at the airport.

COMMISSIONER BLACK:

Commissioner Black reported that he had attended a NACo Board meeting in Washington last week. He also attended an oversight hearing on Public Lands with Jim Evans.
