


Minutes were read and approved

Teek recommended J. Grant be given a one step 90 day probation raise. This was approved by the Commissioners.

Bernal reported he had hired James Vigil as a Temporary employee, and recommended starting salary of 23-1. Approved by the Commissioners. Mike Neely self-terminated on 5-15-78.

Bernal said Energy Fuel had requested a cattleguard; the commissioners suggested we follow the procedures set up by the commission.

Bernal said he had a request from Kloyd Perkins for an approach to a county road. The commissioners said he should make request for the county engineer to give approval

Doug said the BIA is advertizing for bids on the Bluff to Mexican Water Project for the first 8 miles south from the bridge.

The minutes were read and approved on a motion by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Black.

CITY PLANNING COMMISSION

Monticello City Planning Commission and City Counsel met with the County Commissioners to discuss the Chip Sealing of the City Streets. Commissioners Black and Guymon stated that the city had to fill the cracks and the pot holes. When this is done then the County will chip seal the road. The city has about a month to fill the cracks before the county is ready to seal the roads. The city can use the county equipment to fill the cracks.

The also discussed the drainage problems on various county roads within the city limits. The county will attend to these problems on the county roads. The road by the Plateau Station has a drainage problem but the problem is on the state road right-of-way and the city will need to get in touch with the Utah Department of Transportation.

The city planning commission presented the city master plan for roads and annexation. The county stated that if the city couldn't annex the land that they wanted the county would keep the master plan roads right-of-ways clear.

The following people were present: Jim Black, Bruce Adams, Rick Terry, Keith Redd, Hal Jensen, Gene Etherington, and Harold Young.

Commissioner Black stated that the county would like to find a way to do their part on city roads without causing lawsuits or inequities. He stated that the City and the county should work together to provide an equitable proposal for county-city participation in road building. The watchwords should be Equity, Legality, and Ability.

MENTAL HEALTH CONTRACT

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT

The Commissioners approved a resolution for the Community Development Block Grant authorizing the chairman of the San Juan County Commission to submit an application to the Department of Housing and Urban development for funds under the provisions of the 1974 Housing and Community Development Act.

JUSTICE OF THE PEACE

BLUFF MULTIPURPOSE BUILDING

The commissioners discussed the Bluff Multipurpose Center. It had been suggested that the money on the Bluff Multipurpose building be used to purchase some used metal buildings and remodel them into a multipurpose center. The Commissioners stated that there was no way that they could authorize this to be done. In fact, the county might lose the money altogether if they did this.


TAX ANTICIPATION BOND

BEER LICENSE

BLANDING INDUSTRIAL PARK

Mr. Bud Nielson, manager for Blanding City, asked the Commissioners to write a letter stating that extending the water lines south for an industrial park would not violate the San Juan County Zoning Ordinance. The commissioners stated that they gave this proposal their full support. The deputy clerk was instructed to send this letter.

BLANDING CLINIC

The county has been asked to fence the Blanding Clinic area. This is about 420 feet and the bid cost is \$3.00 a foot. Commissioner Boyle will check with the Hospital board and then get with Alma Redd to discuss this.

AOG-MANPOWER COUNCIL

Arlo Freestone has been appointed to serve on the Southeastern Utah Association of Governments Manpower Council. Commissioner Black made this motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Guymon and it passed unanimously.
