

Minutes of the San Juan County Road Meeting.

July 2, 1979

Time: 9:00 A.M.

Present: E. Boyle, B. Dunow, C. Black. Surveyor D. Pehrson, Foremen L. Lyman, A. Holden, L. Adams, & B. Bradford.

Minutes were read and approved.

Teek reported he had a mile of crused gravel and 3 miles of pit run on the Red Mesa Road. He said he was having trouble with water on the Red Mesa Project. He said England Electric would have to pull the pump to fix it. He said he thought if this pump was fixed he could get by o.k.

Bernal reported he had hired George Sickler as a truck driver (26-1) and a permanent employee. Bernal also recommended Brett Lyman be raised to 29-1 as dozer operator. Bernal said he had also hired Ed Hawkins as 26-1. The above recommendations were approved by the Commission.

Doug reported he had surveyed city streets and they would be ready to build when the city was ready.

Travel time to Red Meas from Monticello was discussed. The Commissioners stated the policy and said we should follow the policy. Commissioner Dunow will make a study on this situation and consider some changes.

Meeting adjourned.

Minutes of the Board of County Commissioners meeting held July 9, 1979.

Present: Commission Chairman E. S. Boyle, Commissioners Bill Dunow and Calvin Black. Also present Al Haskins and Deputy Clerk Peggy Jorgensen.

Time: 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of the previous weeks meeting were read and approved with the stipulated corrections. This being done upon a motion made by Commissioner Dunow and seconded by Commissioner Black to carry the motion.

COUNTY RECORDER

Louise Jones met with the Commission to discuss with them possible salary raises for help in her office. She requested that Angie King be raised to \$3.40 per hour, and that Sharon Semadeni be raised (with the tentative wage increase scale) to \$640.69. The Commission stated that she should check the pay scale to be sure these rates are acceptable.

COMMISSIONER BLACK

Commissioner Black reported that there will be a meeting Thursday the 12th of July at the Provo Tech. to inform Auditors, or Deputy Auditors and County Commissioners of recently passed State Laws on revenue limitations.

He also reported that he would attend a meeting of the Revenue and Tax Steering committee Friday. They are going to propose Constitutional revisions for amendments which would totally eliminate the funding of the Uniform School fund from property taxes, and yet assure the school systems of the availability of other resources.

Commissioner Black also presented to the Commission a letter he had received some time ago from Jim Wilson. re: Unemployment Compensation and a letter he had answered Mr. Wilson. These will be on file in the secretary's file.

He also presented a letter he had received for Jay Nelson stating that he had to use more gravel for the airport hangers than he had thought necessary. The Commission approved the billing of \$1248.00 for this extra material and labor. The following is a statement from Doug Pehrson justifying the payment.

SUBJECT: Grade work at the San Juan County Airport

Gentlemen;

I am writing to explain the extra work required to get the gravel to the proper elevation for the hangers at the Monticello Airport. San Juan County Road Dept. prepared the hanger site and did get the proper elevation for the gravel, but in several areas did not get the proper compaction. Therefore, when the contractor compacted the building site, it required additional gravel and additional work. I believe the contractor should be reimbursed for this additional work that was required to get the proper compaction.

DOUG PEHRSON

Doug also discussed with the Commission the width of roads being built in sub-divisions in the County. He will go to Blanding with Commissioner Dunow in the morning for a meeting there with Phil Palmer to discuss the hanger sites at the Blanding airport. They also discussed the County's policies on airports and their being subsidised by the County.

Commissioner Dunow and Doug reported to the Commission the condition of the Foy Lake road. They discussed possible remedies to this problem.

COMMISSIONER DUNOW:

Commissioner Dunow reported to the Commission that a crew is going to put in a new cattleguard at the top of Devils Canyon. He also stated that the crews are about through patching at Lisbon Valley. He also reported that they will begin on the streets in Monticello soon.

COMMISSIONER BOYLE:

Commissioner Boyle reported that he had attended a Hospital Board meeting Wednesday evening in Blanding.

He also reported that he would be attending a meeting on August 2nd. regarding the sewer situation in Bluff. He stated that the Commission would not take any stand on who would vote in the Service district if it should be established, or any other issue for that matter.

He recommended to the Commission that Curtis Pehrson be allowed to use the Commission's adjoining office which they approved. Curtis is the Southern Planner for the District.

AL HASKINS

Al reported that a State Car had sustained damage when a County truck dropped a rock onto its windshield near Red Mesa. Commissioner Boyle will look into the matter.

He reported that the engine in the recreation Jeep had run out of oil and that is why the engine had thrown a rod. He stated that it would cost less than \$200.00 to fix it. The Commission approved of this.

He also reported on the steps he is taking for the landing of the Sky Lab bits and pieces.

He presented for the Commissions approval an application for CETA Title II Governor's Coordination and Special Services funds. The Commission approved of this by a motion made by Commissioner Black and seconded by Commissioner Dunow for a unanimous decision by the Commission. The secretary will write a letter of approval to return with the agreement.



Minutes of the Board of County Commissioners meeting held July 23, 1979.

Present: E. S. Boyle, Commission Chairman, Commissioners Calvin Black and Bill Dunow. Also in attendance, Al Haskins, John Baker and Doug Pehrson. Peggy Jorgensen, Deputy Clerk.

Time: 10:00 A. M.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with the stipulated corrections, this being done upon a motion made by Commissioner Black and seconded by Commissioner Dunow to carry the motion.

COUNTY SALARY RAISES

Commissioner Black made the motion that the Commission approve the raises for County employees as indicated, pursuant to the proposed raises stated at the Public Hearing. Commissioner Dunow seconded the motion, making a unanimous decision by the Commission. The raises as stated will be on file in the secretary's file.

COMMISSIONER BLACK REPORTS

Commissioner Black reported that the meetings in Kansas City revealed information about rural affairs and the development of energy impact assistance, for areas where energy development is active. Public Land issues relating to energy were discussed. In Lieu taxes and general revenue sharing were also discussed.

He also reported that there will be a State Wilderness meeting August 3rd, and the Committee will state its position on management plans and wilderness proposals.

The Commission expressed its approval for the organization of a meeting with the Commissioners of Wayne, Kane, Garfield, Grand and San Juan Counties. Commissioner Black will prepare a statement for the entire area on the Glen Canyon National Recreation Area/Wilderness.

There will be an Association of Governments board meeting August 2, 1979 at 10 A. M. in the San Juan County Courthouse.

COMMISSIONER DUNOW

Commissioner Dunow reported that he had met with the City Commission Wednesday on streets, and that light poles will have to be moved so that the streets can be rebuilt. As soon as this is accomplished the County will do its job. He also reported that the County had replaced a cattle-guard on Peters Point Road, and that the road going up the mountain will be worked on soon.

COMMISSIONER BOYLE

Commissioner Boyle stated that he concurred with Commissioner Black on the meetings in Kansas City being informative and that they obtained a lot of good information. He also discussed with the Commission the need to re-roof the Courthouse and that there needs to be built a partition in the Justice of the Peace office. The Commission authorized him to get quotes for both of these projects and make the final decision.

CLEAL BRADFORD

Cleal Bradford met with the Commission to discuss with them the \$1500 allocated for the Senior Citizens at White Mesa. Commissioner Dunow made the motion that they be allowed to carpet their building if that is what they desire to do with their money. Commissioner Black seconded the motion for a unanimous decision by the Commission.
